



## CALVIN MORBERG

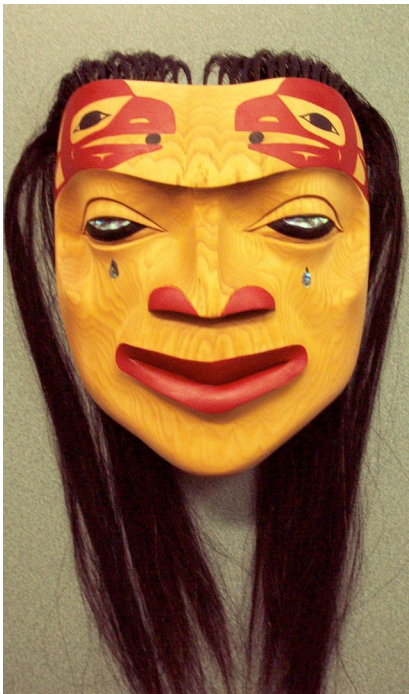

Born into the Tlingit Eagle Clan in 1983, Calvin Morberg was raised in Whitehorse and inspired by the work of local Tlingit artists. Influenced by his heritage and its carving traditions that date back thousands of years, he started learning with Tlingit carver Alex Dickson and has since studied under several other renowned and established Yukon artists.

The Prime Minister was presented with one of Calvin's masks as a gift from the Council of Yukon First Nations in 2006; Calvin has since been commissioned to create a mask for the Canada Winter Games Host Society.

Calvin has instructed beginner carvers at the Youth Achievement Centre and Sundog Retreat programs since 2005.



Calvin has exhibited his work at the Blue Feather Youth Centre and the Captain Martin's Gallery in Whitehorse.

In 2003, he was selected to participate in the Yukon Art Society's Artists-in-the-Park Program.

In 2005, he was chosen to travel with a group of aboriginal artists to Arizona and Peru to display his talents.

Calvin works primarily in wood and ivory. He and his partner Gayle also spend a lot of time caring for and enjoying their young son Elijah.
