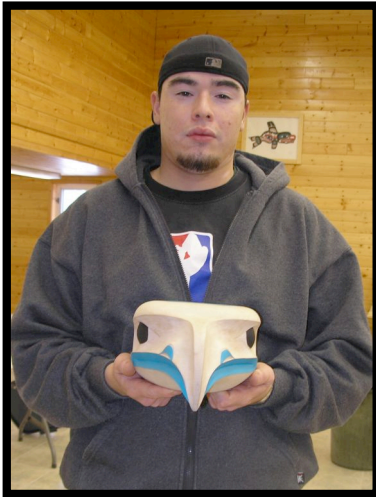

William is a member of the Daklaweidi clan of Teslin Tlingit First Nation and has been carving on and off since his late teens but is now a full-time carver. William's work is displayed in galleries in Vancouver, Juneau and Anchorage, and one of his masks was presented as a gift to the Governor General of Canada. He also had three pieces on display at the United Nations building in New York, NY.

William is a member of a traditional dance group and has gone on tour to share the stories of his culture. He has danced at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City and loves to dance at the biannual international Tlingit celebration in Juneau, Alaska. William would also like to spread the culture of his ancestors elsewhere around the world.

William has studied with well known Yukon carvers Keith Wolfe Smarch, Ken Anderson, Eugene Alfred, Vernon Asp, Calvin Morberg and Lewis McKenna. He enjoys making masks, paddles, combs, panels and plaques.
